I would like to thank everyone that either volunteered during the season or came along to our functions, it is greatly appreciated. We hope to continue to see you down at the club next season.



This year was fairly routine in relation to our grounds. There were no significant projects that needed to be carried out. Probably the most significant piece of work we had done this season was the repair of the nets in the batting tunnels - something that was overdue.

Putting them up is a bit more labour intensive than pulling them down, so any extra help when we put them up again later this year would be most welcome, particularly if we have a shorter window due to Lacrosse's season going a bit later due to the Covid -19 pandemic.

Both our reel mower and ride on are nearing the end of their working lives. They've been worked hard over many years and we'll need to replace them when we can afford it. In fact our reel mower (which produces our best infield surface) is at the mechanics now and may not be repairable.

We were pretty lucky with the weather this year, but there were a few occasions when we had to work hard to make sure the ground was playable in wet weather. Again, when we can afford it, we would really benefit from tarps that completely cover our cut-outs.


