

From the Chairman

Firstly, I must thank our hard-working committee, many whom I've known most of my life and it's been again a pleasure working with you all again in my 5th year in 2022/23. A shout out to Jo Owen, Jane Nicholson, and Megan Oliver, who has been outstanding with our junior development as Junior Director. Thanks to Lucy Owen with her role with club facilities, Noel Watson for his ever-hard work with maintaining the grounds with his assistants Craig Reval and Terry Fitzgerald. Other helpers throughout the season, which threw us many challenges with lots of inclement weather. Josh Mignone who was instrumental in co-ordinating and forming our winter ball comp from 1 team in 2021 to 3 in 2023 including lots of junior parents now participating and enjoying the game and to Renae Kortekaas and Shane Brown our other floating board members. We are working on a restructure with the board and roles with a Special meeting held prior to the AGM with these important changes.

The 2022/2023 season was a highly successful one as a club. We had more Senior & Junior memberships with over 90 in each for the club and more than we have had in over a decade. We had 5 teams in Finals and 3 in Grand Finals, culminating in 2 premiership wins.

For the first time in the clubs history, we had 8 Senior teams playing, including the new Women's Div 2 and were well represented in Junior Grades with T Ball, Mini League, Minor League, 2 Under 13's, Under 14 Intermediate League and an Under 15 team. The Under 15 team winning the premiership with one loss for the whole season. Under 13 Division 1 also making the Grand Final and losing to Golden Grove, the future looks bright.

I will start with Women's Div 1 side, who won theirs and the clubs maiden Division 1 premiership. They were the benchmark all year and had a resounding win in the Grand Final against Southern Districts. The other high note was 7 of this team's selection into the SA Senior Women's team who played in the recent National Women's championship and did exceptionally well to win the Bronze medal over Queensland. A huge congratulations to Carly Moore who won the Women's Division 1 Medal and Female High-Performance Athlete of the year and Darna Boers-Veen being the runner up in the medal. Well done to all of these amazing ladies.

Division 1 Men's were a definite finals contender with a great start to the season, sitting in 3rd at the break, but unfortunately, had dropped away at some critical times post-Christmas finishing just outside the finals race, we some nice wins against some top 6 sides and showed we are knocking on the door. A big thanks to Richard Olson our outgoing coach and assistants Troy Weinert and Brayden Marchioro. A big welcome and thanks to our newly appointed coach for 2023/24 season Lawrie Moore and we are hopeful of a really bright next season and a push towards the play offs.

Division 2 had an excellent season, making the preliminary finals after a great upset Elimination final win against Sturt at Sturt in Week 1. Then a narrow loss to Henley & Grange in Week 2, they played some great team baseball all year. A big thanks to Ryan Muggleton & Daniel Chapman for their leadership with this team.

Women's Division 2 were our newest side formed within the club. The ladies played on Friday nights and were highly competitive just missing out on a finals berth. Some experienced players, some Port Adelaide softballers and junior women made up the team. Congratulations to Alice Brown on finishing 3rd in the Women's Division 2 medal count for Baseball SA.

Div 3 had another outstanding season, probably a bit unlucky to not make finals for the 2^{nd} consecutive year. Thanks again to Shane Brown for his leadership in coaching the team and to Tyson Hancock for making the Top 5 Vote getters in the competition.

Div 6 did it tough, without recording a win. Despite this the team were really cohesive and had lots of fun with several new Junior Dads really learning the game well and we had several close losses with 3 walk off losses alone. Well done team on your great attitude and effort.

Div 7 again made finals for this team for the 5th consecutive year. Finishing the minor round in 3rd place, unfortunately losing the home final to eventual premier Adelaide and being knocked out as the unlucky loser due to another result not going our way. These guys always have a great deal of fun playing with our most experienced team and thousands of games amongst them there is always plenty of banter on the bench. Thanks again to Garry Marsland and Grant Behrendt for taking on the coaching duties this year, you both did a great job.

Div 8 had an up and down year but again really enjoyed their baseball and we managed to blood a lot of new players into the game, and they weren't too far off a finals berth. A big thanks to Aaron Petros for coaching the side at late notice and to all those senior players who supported the new guys, well done.

To finish the 2022/23 season on what an exceptional note we have just had two girls represent the U15 Girls SA team at the National Championships, well done to Indie and Dakota. Both Toby Kortekaas and Amara Quinn represented SA in Under 16s and Women's National Championships, Oliver Hayes and Diesel Fallon both finishing in the top 5 medal count for Under 15 with Oliver winning the medal. Alice Brown whilst being a first year under 15 finished 3rd in the Senior Women's Div 2 medal on the back of some great pitching performances throughout the year and Kylah Ding in the top 5 for Minor League. We were also represented at the State Charter Championships in late April, by no less than 13 Junior players across all divisions in the championships. I think it reflects the great progression we have made in the last 3 years as a club and supporting and fostering a great environment for juniors to develop and learn the game. A big thankyou to everyone for your efforts.

Thanks again to all our coaches, volunteers, scorers, members, players and parents for supporting the Woodville Baseball Club and really looking forward to next season.

Junior Report

This season we had 98 junior players registered at Woodville - 63 of those played junior baseball at Woodville, 31 of those were registered in our T-Ball program whether it be at the club on a Friday night or registered at one of our school programs and 7 junior senators that played senior baseball - Toby Kortekaas, Aldo McCormack and Amara Quinn who played Men's senior baseball, Amara who played Women's Division 1 and Indie O'Hazy-Zschorn, Dakota Ding, Alice Brown and Jasmine Fawcett who played Women's Division 2. We also had Toby and Zach Stanmeyre who were registered to Woodville but on permit to West Torrens and Port Adelaide for the season to play U17.

Over the last couple of seasons, we have had a great number of juniors in Under 11 and Under 13 but when it comes to Under 15, players seem to drop off and don't want to play anymore - I did some checking and found that one of the reasons that kids stopped playing was because the Win/Loss ratio wasn't good and the kids weren't enjoying themselves - coming to training to lose every week was not fun. So, at the start of the season before we registered any teams Jane Nicholson and I went to Baseball SA to ask for some guidance, help and understanding - our aim for the next 2-3 years is to have our juniors continue playing past Under 15 and playing Under 17, Under 19 and into senior baseball but we need to be winning and the kids need to be enjoying themselves. So, we asked if we could drop from Division 1 in Under 15 to Division 2 just so we could see some smiles back on these kids' faces, and hope that they would want to continue playing. Baseball SA agreed and allowed us to include a team in Under 14's for the first time and Under 15 Division 2. We were thrilled that Baseball SA listened and gave us this opportunity to set our juniors on the right path. Then came the dilemma of deciding whether we have a Pee Wee team, Under 10 Mini League team or possibly two Under 11 Minor League teams. I swapped back and forth for a number of weeks to try and get the right combination of players and teams. We just missed out on the Pee Wee deadline by one player and then had to go with 14 kids in Under 10, which wasn't ideal. If I had a crystal ball at that time I would have run with both teams, and it probably would have worked! I will definitely remember that for next season.

So, in the end we had 7 Junior teams consisting of;

- T-Ball program
- Under 10 Mini League
- Under 11 Minor League
- Under 13 Little League Division 1
- Under 13 Little League Division 2
- Under 14 Intermediate League
- Under 15 Junior League Division 2.

We played from Southern Districts to Gawler and everywhere in between. Whilst we saw a massive improvement in a lot of players, we saw that above all they were having fun and enjoying themselves. We are pleased to say that 2 out 6 teams got into the finals and both teams made it to the Grand Final. - our Little League Division 1 team and our Junior League Division 2 team. Our Junior League team won their Grand Final versus Adelaide in an epic 3-hour game with the score changing a number of times, but the team ultimately won 10-9. Unfortunately, the Little League team lost their Grand Final versus Golden Grove Central Districts in a hard fought, loud, and stressful game 10-5. I am very proud of the players and coaches and the fantastic season that both teams had. To reach a grand final is a massive achievement and they should all be very proud of themselves.

While it is an interesting time trying to find the right combination for teams and finding players - it's also as interesting and challenging to find coaches - I am thankful this season that a lot of my coaches were willing to continue from last season. Unfortunately, an appearance in the finals eluded us.

This season we fielded a team of 12 players, comprised of a mix of three players who had played Minor League last year, six who had moved up from Pee Wee, and three players who had never played before. It is a testament to the great work and focus on our Junior Senators that we see new faces joining the club and enjoying themselves while learning a new sport. One of the more difficult but ultimately enjoyable parts of baseball at this age group is identifying players who can pitch. 
