

# Facilities Report.

This year being my first year was challenging. I have always wanted to help out with grounds but was never afforded the opportunity. It is a very rewarding position to have, in particular the positive comments from representatives of all Clubs.

This didn't just happen; it took hard work and tough decisions over many years to get to where we are today.

Added to this the uncanny weather culminating in extra work maintaining the high standards of the best ground in the league; our equipment took a battering. It is more than likely that my predecessors took the foot off the pedal as far as maintenance of equipment.

The greatest outlay was the ride on mower, which is still not 100% yet. The list of casualties are as follows:

\*Ride-on Mower: approx. \$500 spent and possibly another \$250?

\*Push mower-rotor plate collar shattered: likely outcome is that it would be better to replace it at a cost of \$300 to \$400.

\*Whipper shippers: both have issues with cracked housings and overheating of cutter head. Likely outcome is that we could make one out of the two. These items are more of a home style and not suited to prolonged use. A more industrial type would be better suited.

\*Blower 240V- motor blown: been using my own Ryobi battery blower. Recommend to purchase same or similar.

\*Cylinder mower: drive sprocket has completely stripped. Send to Seaton Mowers for repair and sharpening of cylinder and sole plate in the off season. Cost unknown at this stage.

We have been granted a Discretionary Ward Allowance of \$3674.00 for shelters on the Junior Diamond. This is approx. 50% of the quoted price. I will be in touch with Brad Grose to discuss a better price.

Grounds did not escape either. It was exposed to a nasty fungus which was too expensive to eradicate with chemicals, so we had to ride it out. We also had a black beetle outbreak in the outfield but that was towards the end of the season.

I did receive a lot of help during the season which I am thankful for. My work did however impact more and more on my role as the season went on, due to circumstances beyond my control. I was not able to give the time I initially did have to the role.

I appreciated the opportunity to perform the duties required and look forward to continuing to help as much as permissible.

# Club Report.

A busy year for season 2016-17, with a couple of new projects through the season, fine-tuning the new kitchen, consisting mainly of exchanging the dishwasher fitted in the make-over for a commercial grade unit more suited to the task. Again, our Councillors and their Colleagues at The City of Charles Sturt have been keen to assist us in improving the Club.

We now have a Defibrillator, courtesy of a Discretionary Ward Allowance, which will increase the chances of survival in medical emergencies for any patrons of the Club. Due to fortunate timing of the purchase we were also able to acquire a new, comprehensive first aid kit at no cost to the Club. The AED is mounted in easy reach of the rooms or field near the back entrance of the building and is very simple to use, giving step by step audio instructions. An instructional DVD is also available for anyone wishing to familiarize themselves with its use.

The biggest project has been the fitting of solar panels to the batting tunnel roof, this time with the assistance of Council's 'Green Buildings' initiative. Not complete at the time of writing, the system will be connected by the end of June at a minimal cost to the Club, the majority of the \$10 000 cost coming from the Grant and expected to return savings of up to \$2500 per season at present rates. With all the preparations involved in a project like this, from early planning in taking advantage of a State Government energy audit program, to quotes and Grants proposals, this has been a three year undertaking. Thanks also to Hayman's Electrical and Adelaide Commercial Electrical for their assistance with this project. Remember to consider supporting our Sponsors when you can.

A volunteer grant sourced from the Federal Government last year has funded the purchase of a new portable PA system, along with new IT equipment and software to go some way to making life easier for volunteers busy with the day to day business of running a club. All purchases were carefully considered to maximise the ongoing benefit to the Club.

One of the more frustrating aspects of maintaining the Club's facilities is the cost (and time) of repairing damaged playing equipment, fixtures and fittings resulting from the lack of respect and/or control some Players display when things don't go their way. Volunteer's have enough to deal with without adding to the workload so, to those few people responsible, please consider the consequences of your actions.

With it now being time for me to step down after seven years, I would like to thank all the people who have been only too willing to help out around the Club during that time. There are few new faces, many who have been there longer than me and continue to shoulder some of the load. To all who have helped in the canteen and bar, thank you, it is a very important part of the financial security and future prosperity of the Club. If I start naming names I'm bound to miss someone so, please accept my thanks, (but keep doing it, the work doesn't stop).

# Junior Report.

We started off prior to the season again this year with our ever expanding Winter Academy which was run by Lawrie Moore and assisted by David Gray. This has become a fixture for our juniors pre-season over the past few years and all that attended have benefitted from Lawrie's experience and setting them up for success early in the season. Players ranged in age from U11's right through to U17's players, I hope to see this continue and to gain further interest from returning and new players to the Club

Thanks largely to the support of the 5023 Club and the free fees that were offered this year to all junior players, we were able to field teams in all age groups and 2 teams in the Under 15's. The support that has been offered by the 5023 Club has gone an exceptionally long way in building our junior numbers this year and to create a strong foundation for us to continue our recruitment on throughout the off season.

Under 17's had a strong year, coached by Michael Doyle they finished strongly in  $5^{th}$  position and progressed to the preliminary final sadly going down in a well fought game against the eventual premiers West Torrens.

U15's fielded a team in each division this year which was great to see. Numbers were a little tight in each team throughout the year but luckily some players were able to play 2 games to make up the numbers and we managed to field two sides each week. Unfortunately, neither team had many wins on the board this year. Thank you to Sean & Bernie Conlon and Derek Milne for taking on the coaching roles this year and assisting each other to ensure all the players had a chance to learn and grow in training and on game day.

U13's started off the season low on numbers but thanks to some of the U11 players for stepping up and some mid-year recruiting they finished the year strongly and just missed out on a finals place. Lawrie Moore and Graham Newbound did a brilliant job in developing the skills of this group this year.

U11's were coached by David Gray with James Stradling assisting. They had a great year with 8 wins from 15 and finishing  $3^{\rm rd}$  on the ladder

T-ball saw an influx of numbers this year and was run by Scott Romain and Shane Brown. They have both done a brilliant job with implementing the All Star round robin competition which had the t-ballers playing a variety of Friday night games throughout the western suburbs bringing more teams and parents together at the Club.

This year we moved away from the traditional Junior Presentation Night with T-ball held separately and instead held a Presentation Day. We were able to bring in a few attractions on the day such as a bouncy castle for the younger kids and a pitching target for the older kids. Thanks to some amazing weather, the event was held outside and after presentation a parents vs kids game was held. The kids all had a great time and the Club was alive with activity, I hope to see this new format continue as a fun day to bring the parents and kids back to the Club one final time before the season end.

# Finance Report.

The MYOB Accounting system has been used to record the finances of the Woodville District Baseball Club Inc. as at  $30^{th}$  April, 2017

The following Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement have been prepared by Tonkin Accounting using the resources and information contained in the accounting system.

To my knowledge they are a true representation of the accounts of the club as audited by Kimani Nganga of Tonkin Accounting.

The Profit and Loss statement shows us as running at a loss of \$215, however, please take into account the depreciation figure of \$11043.

Our Fundraising areas are up thanks to the Bunning's BBQ's (Thanks to Pattie and the volunteers.) The Senators 5023 club has certainly boosted the coffers, thanks go the Cutting family and Craig, Marie, Pattie and all their helpers for setting this up.

Our Sponsorships are still down on previous years and we as a Club must endeavour to gain more Sponsors. All Players and Members are encouraged to gain Sponsors which will also earn them a discount on their fees.

The canteen continues to run at a profit which bolsters the Clubs finances considerably but we are down on last year. The fact we had only nine Sunday home games compared to previous seasons of 12 has a significant effect on revenue.

Thursday nights attendances were down but hopefully as we continue to rebuild the culture at the Club increased numbers will stay for meals. I thank all our volunteers that keep it running so well.

I would also like to thank Dave Owen who was instrumental once again in successfully obtaining a Council Grant for solar panels and then organising everything involved in getting the job done. This will benefit both the Baseball and Lacrosse Clubs with an expected reduction to total power bills of as much as \$4500 a year.

I would also like to thank outgoing Board Members for all of their hard work and effort, some which have given many years of service to our club. I appreciate it.


