We have been particularly active in trying to grow and develop Junior baseball at Woodville this year. We recently attended the Youth Sports Expo at the Basketball stadium in conjunction with Baseball SA to try and target junior players, also Shane Lodge along with Gary and Theo visited Seaton High School and we are aiming to recruit players that don't currently have a club from Seaton and Peter Gee is assisting us with this.

We have appointed Troy Nicholson as the Div 2 coach for the 2019/20 season and Shane Nicholson as his assistant and thank both of these guys for putting their hand up to assist, already Troy is getting guys together in the offseason and doing a lot of the local groundwork that is required in the offseason, so thanks Troy and we look forward to you leading the Div 2 side next season.

We have already confirmed 4 new senior players for the 2019/20 season and will keep working hard as a board and with our players and coaches during the off season to increase our numbers and to try and create a good competitive environment. We will be seeking an import pitcher for next season and preferably a two-way player, we are in discussions at present with potential players. 

Facilities Report

This season has been a hard season. We have also had fewer games at the best Diamond in the league. The back Diamond got very little use.

Personally I wasn't able to commit as much "love" as I have in previous seasons to our great facilities. My erratic work hours prevented me from preparing early and from attending board meetings. Shane Nicholson has been invaluable by filling that void. Thank you very much Shane. Thank you also to others that have helped with set up during the season.

We have had as in other years; casualties with ageing equipment. Edger with shattered conrod - not repairable, Cylinder mower self-drive/mechanical failures - fixed in-house, Whipper snippers - not suitable for large areas/overheating, Ride on mower threw a lifter - repaired by Seaton Mowers. I was able to secure a \$5000.00 grant for equipment and facilities. I purchased 2 x 4 stroke Honda whipper snippers, 1 x 4 stroke 4 blade push mower, 1 x 4 stroke edger, 1 x 2 stroke Stihl blower (instead of using my Ryobi blower) plus fuel containers and oils. This was approximately \$2300.00 from Seaton Mowers. All the new equipment has been tested out already and work brilliantly. The remainder of the grant will go to good use within the club.

Erecting the fences was an ongoing process with Morty, Johnny and some of the OBG's volunteering to erect the Foul line and Bull pen fences. Thanks fellas. Pulling down of the fences this season went smoothly with extra vehicles/trailers speeding up the process. The volunteer numbers were adequate and very much appreciated, it was however the usual suspects again! We cannot stress enough that we need volunteers, new volunteers because one day "the usual suspects" won't be there!

Thank you also to Charles Sturt Council for their continued great work with our grounds.

Financial Report

The MYOB Accounting system has been used to record the finances of the Woodville District Baseball Club Inc. as at 30th April, 2019.

The following Balance Sheet and Income Statement have been prepared by Tonkin Accounting using the resources and information contained in the accounting system. To my knowledge they are a true representation of the accounts of the Club as audited by Steve Tonkin and Jack Yang of Tonkin Accounting.

The Profit and Loss statement shows us as running at a loss of \$9760 but if you take into account the depreciation we actually ran at a small profit.

The Senators 5023 Club has helped the club once again, so thanks go to Craig, Marie, Pattie and the 5023 Committee for running two functions.

We were lucky enough to get a Bunnings BBQ which also helps with fundraising.


