This past season was my first in the role and I was not sure of what was involved. Thanks to Shane Nicholson I was able to be guided on what had to be done week to week.

A weeding day was organised, and the support was amazing, I didn't count numbers but there were a lot of volunteers. The bases had a lawn bowling green look to them. All the bases where weeded and edged except third base which I was able to finish the following week. The fences were erected in time again with help from our volunteers.

The Reel mower was repaired only to be sent back again. It has been fixed now and working well; there are still some issues but it's doing the job. We purchased a new John Deere ride on mower with the help of a grant. After a couple of user errors (my fault) it works, and we now have a reliable first-class mower. The old Greenfield is still in operation and many thanks to Derek Milne is now in good working order. It was given a new drive belt, oil change, spark plug and new blades. It should go another ten years. It also had a new tyre put on at the start of the season.

The grounds looked good for most of the season and with some help from the council and timely rain I think we can be happy with the way it presented for the games. It was watered four times a week after Christmas which did help enormously. I weeded the bases and trimmed the edges and few times during the season to keep up appearances. With help and guidance from Lawrie Moore the fences were whipper snipped during the year and this makes a big difference.

I am still looking for help so if you can offer any time at all it would be appreciated. We will need help with:

- Fences; erecting them and then dismantling them
- Game day set up on Sundays and Saturday mornings

We will not be having a weeding day this season. I have help from Craig Reval through the off season with the bases. We weed them often and edge when needed. We have worked on the bullpen with good results, cleaned the fridge in the shed and cleaned our dug out. Our next project is the opposition bullpen and dugout. Don't forget it's our club. We constantly mow behind the shed to keep the weeds down and now mow behind the home plate.

I have asked the council to help with the opposition spectator area and they have promised to re-seed the trouble spots for us. They are also at my request delivering clean soil for us to be used on the diamond where it is needed.

It could be said that at the last AGM I was in the wrong place at the wrong time and ended up being given this role in the club. But I have enjoyed it and I find it extremely rewarding knowing that my small contribution helps to keep the grounds in good condition. Thanks Garry.



Financial Report

The MYOB Accounting system has been used to record the finances of the Woodville District Baseball Club Inc. as at 30th April, 2021.

The following Balance Sheet and Income Statement have been prepared by Tonkin Accounting using the resources and information contained in the accounting system. To my knowledge they are a true representation of the accounts of the Club as audited by Steve Tonkin and Jack Yang of Tonkin Accounting.

The Profit and Loss statement shows us as running at a profit of \$311 but if we take into account the Depreciation it was actually a much higher profit this year.

We must also keep in mind that we saved around \$10000 in expenses because of not being able to have Gary or an import come over so that makes our profit margin higher as well.

With Covid-19 restrictions affecting many things we still managed to get one Bunnings BBQ which is always a good financial boost.

The canteen continues to run at a great profit which helps the club considerably thanks to our hardworking volunteers that make this possible and to the members for supporting it.

The Bar also ran at a higher than usual profit this year in part due to members staying at the club. Thanks to them as well.


