A HISTORY OF THE WOODVILLE DISTRICT BASEBALL CLUB

Toward the end of the 1949 winter baseball season a group of players got together during the intervals at the Woodville picture theatre and decided that the long distances required to cycle to Saturday games and Sunday morning trainings was not in their best interest. At Kurt Erdmann's suggestion they decided the formation of a local club was the answer.

Kurt Erdmann, Don Klæbe, Peter Abbott, and several others pursued the idea and in 1950 the Woodville District Baseball Club came into being. The inaugural committee consisted of Mr. W Erdmann (Kurt's father) as President, Mr. H.L Collins as Secretary, Mr. Don Klæbe as Treasurer and Mr. W.J.F Somerville as Club Coach.

The Mayor of the local Council has traditionally been the Patron of the club.

Mr. W Erdmann was President until 1953. Mr. Arthur Sewell became the longest serving person in the position of President from 1955 until the 1968/69 season. Mr. Don Klæbe except for the years of 1955 and 1956 when he was Secretary held the treasurer's portfolio from 1950 until the 1971/72 season when he was transferred to Melbourne in his employment. On return from Melbourne Don again took the position from the 2001/2 season until the 2008/9 season. Unfortunately, part way through his last season Don passed away and the club lost probably the most passionate supporter the club will ever see.

Fawkes Reserve located on Hanson Road Woodville North was the club home ground until 1958. In March 1959 the Findon Oval became and remains the clubs home ground. The reserve was renamed the Don Klæbe Field in recognition of Dons achievements at the club in 2010. The two grounds were vastly different as Fawkes Reserve was eminently suitable for winter baseball because of its sandy soil. Findon Oval had hundreds of tons of soil trucked in to build up and level the surface and it took quite a while before it become the surface it is today. The original diamond was in the area now used as a playground and tennis courts. In the early years Don Klæbe spent untold hours before and after work planting grasses and weeding the infield area while the council gradually improved the rest of the ground.

In 1950 all clubs had designated areas and the top 2 grades (Major A & B) players were required to live within the area. Other teams were the Minor grades (Minor A through to Minor G). In later years boundaries were eliminated and Grades become Division 1, 2 etc.

Three teams were nominated in the first year of the club and each one made the finals.

Minor A lost the semi-final 10-7 to Railways. Minor D lost the Grand Final 14-6 to Kensington and Minor F lost the Preliminary Final 31-4 to Glenelg (handicapped by only having 8 players).

In 1952 the Minor A team won the premiership from West Torrens 6-2 and in 1953 the Club was promoted to the Majors. The Major A side was runner up in the competition in its first year. They lost the Grand Final to Prospect 5-4 after 12 innings. Although being the newest club in the league in 1958 the club had the most teams competing in the SABL with 10 teams covering all grades.

The Clubrooms were erected in 1959 measuring 56ft (17m) by 30 ft (9m) at a cost of 1513 pounds (\$3026) which did not include the considerable hours of volunteer work. Kurt Erdmann being a major contributor. Extensions were built during 1970/71 and 1994/95. Outdoor Batting tunnels were replaced with indoor batting facilities in 2002. Further work to accommodate equipment etc. was added to the tunnels in 2008/9 and soundproofing of the batting tunnels to stop external noise in 2010/11.

Baseball transitioned from winter to summer competition from 1968/9 season to 1970/71 with all grades playing summer ball from 1971/72.

Over the years the club has won 85 premierships in various grades with 3 Division 1 premierships (1972/73, 1974/75 & 1980/81). The club's most successful competition season was the 1974/75 season with all teams from division 1 to division 5 plus under 15 winning premierships. Only the under 13 team missed out. **(See APPENDIX C for Division 1 premier team photos)**

Initially an igloo type cage was used on the main diamond, and this was eventually replaced with a 30ft high backstop. Due to deterioration a new backstop incorporating lockable bench areas was installed in 2011/12. Unfortunately, because of engineering requirements the construction took longer than anticipated and for part of the season games had to be played at other venues. The Council replaced the dilapidated backstop on the second diamond in 2014 which enhanced protection for adjacent properties. Over-all the playing area is considered by both club members and those from other clubs in South Australia and visitors from interstate as one of the best in Adelaide.

The club hosted the Goodwill Series for 20+ years. This series pitted the South Australian junior state sides against teams from the USA. The USA teams were organized by Bob Williams for the majority of the years until his health deteriorated and in later years his son took over. Bob Williams was inducted into the Klæbe Club in recognition of his work and his generous donations to the club.

The Klæbe Club was started at the 50th year reunion of the club in 2000 at the Woodville Town Hall. Named after Don Klæbe who had since the inception of the club worked tirelessly on and off the field for the betterment of all facets of the club. Each year the Klæbe Club members meet to decide whether to recognize others who meet the criteria for membership.

2019 has seen the Charles Sturt Council refurbish all toilets and wet areas. At the same time seating in both the change rooms has been upgraded. Due to the breakdown of refrigeration units, it was necessary for the Sports club to purchase new refrigerators for the canteen and Bar.

Until the 1982/83 season the club had a 12-month lease of the ground and for many years after baseball seasons changed to summer were able to sublet the ground during the winter months.

Allenby Gardens Football Club were the first to make use of our ground and facilities for several years until their club disbanded. MU Findon Soccer Club followed for quite a few seasons until gaining promotions through the divisions the requirements demanded by the Soccer Federation were such they had to move to a new ground.

In the 1983/84 season at the instigation of Council a Sports Club was formed. The baseball club and the Woodville Lacrosse Club each having representation on the Woodville Baseball/Lacrosse Sports Club. The sports club derives its income from contributions from both clubs and has the responsibility of clubroom maintenance and improvements etc. and is the holder of the Liquor License. This arrangement is still maintained today with Baseball having the facilities in summer and Lacrosse in the winter.

In the 2018/19 the club was proud to be able to field a women's baseball team which in its first season was unlucky to miss the playoffs by one game.

In January 2021 the club celebrated 70 years with a reunion at The Lakes Hotel (our major sponsors) and was well attended. Memorabilia such as old scorebooks, past playing uniforms, photos etc. were on display.

Prior to the reunion a subcommittee of senior members had been asked to select a Platinum year team and the side was announced to the people present. The players that were selected in the team and were at the function were presented to the people in attendance.

A special uniform top was designed and worn by the division1 team throughout the season. A spectators replica jersey was on sale to club members.

The Canteen

During the sixties there was a program of games for juniors to play against Sacred Heart College students on Sundays. Don Klæbe in his usual manner became involved and transported players and equipment. He decided that it would be good if the players and spectators could grab a snack or a drink while at the games.

From small beginnings this developed into the canteen in the clubrooms which his mother Olive staffed for some years and the canteen became recognized as one of the best in baseball circles. Over the years this standard has been kept up due to the magnificent women who have volunteered their time to tirelessly run the canteen when games are played on Don Klæbe reserve. For many years now the canteen has provided meals after games and Thursday training nights. It has become a very important part of the club's revenue.

200 Club

The 200 club was brought into being in the 1970's

John Ryan suggested to the then Board that as an incentive to keep players at the club that players that had been with the club for some years be recognized for their loyalty to the club.

It was decided that 200 games played would be suitable for this. At this time for a player to play 20 games in a season they needed to be playing double headers or their team to make finals. This equated to ten years or more playing for the Club.

In the initial years the players were presented at the trophy presentation night with a pewter mug inscribed with "200 club and their name". this mug would be kept at the clubrooms and each time the player attended their first drink was free.

Unfortunately, rising costs of pewter mugs and drinks forced the club to cancel the free drink and eventually supply the player with a suitably engraved glass mug.

However, it was subsequently decided to further recognize longevity with the club to include milestone games (300, 400, 500 etc.)

Although with the introduction of more games per year which has seen a few players (some by the end of their junior grade games) qualify in much less time than 10 years it has become a badge of honour to become a member of the 200 club. Below is shown one of the original mugs

5023 Club

Formed during the 2016/17 season to raise money for junior baseball. The theme being "It's all about kids playing baseball".

Fundraising was by inviting people to pay a predetermined amount to attend luncheons (2 per season) with guest speakers. In addition to a 2-course meal, drinks were provided.

These functions were quite successful and continued until interrupted by the Covid pandemic during the 2020/21 season.

Several grants from funds raised have been allocated to the club junior program

Hopefully this will be able to be reintroduced in the future.

Club Juniors

Thanks to more involvement from the Board and a lot of commitment from club players and parents of existing players the increase in Junior players within the club has seen a vast improvement in numbers recently.

Programs for both boys and girls to play T-Ball, Pee Wee, etc. have been put in place.

The Mark Biggins Award

The Mark Biggins Award was introduced to the club in honour of Mark's unique love for our Club. Mark unfortunately passed away at a young age due to cancer. He was a dedicated player, loved being a part of our club and helped coach right to the end of his short life. His courage and determination was a credit to himself and his family. His #22 was retired in honour of Mark. His uniform top is now proudly displayed in the clubrooms. His baseball shoes were bronzed and now form the trophy awarded to the "CLUB PLAYER OF THE YEAR". This is an award not for the "best" player but awarded for all the attributes that Mark had.

TEAM MAN, DEDICATION TO TRAINING, CLUB FIRST APPROACH, RESPECT & BRAVERY.

Each year his parents attend the Club Presentation Night to present the trophy which is voted on by the coaches throughout the club

Winter Baseball

The club for the first time in many years entered a side in the Winter ball Competition in 2021.

This was obviously enjoyed by those participating and has led to the Club entering 3 teams in 2022 Both males and females are combining in these sides and we are expecting some of these players to join the ranks in the summer season.

The name **Senators** was adopted during the change of baseball season from winter to summer. Original thoughts by some on committee was we adopt the name Cardinals, but it was wisely decided that WC on the cap was not suitable. (The Kensington Club did take on the Cardinal name).

Senior Club of the Year – Ohlstrom Shield (Awarded to the club accumulating the most premierships points over the season for the three highest grades of SABL competitions).

Woodville have won it 12 times.

John Ryan coached Two Premierships in (1972/73 and 1974/75). John Galloway was the other successful premierships coach in 1980/81.

The games played record is held by Keith Mortimore who played his 1000th game in December 2018. He started playing in 1956 when the club was playing out of Fawkes Reserve and played every season until he retired after the 2020/21 season.

John who played in the first years of the club played 36 games.

Pat impacted the game of baseball in many ways for a very long time with a complete care capacity, skills, and passion for the game

For 22 consecutive years she was the scorer for SA Junior teams from 1971 to 1992

She was a friend and a mentor in her several facets of involvement

An extract from Pat's eulogy presented by Kevin Jennings outlines many valid points: *"Pat coached Little League, scored top level seniors, travelled overseas and interstate to support her teams. Pat always encouraged and supported scorers of all levels, was known to provide rulebooks and other useful scoring tools to those who did not have them or simply something to improve their skills"*.

Pat was a silent worker, who just helped, assisted, and went about her work with no fanfare.

Tony Harris

Tony's baseball career has spanned over 50 years at Club, State, National and International levels

Tony was selected 7 times as a Claxton Shield player and 3 years with the Adelaide Giants. When retiring from playing he coached the Adelaide Giants and Adelaide Bite for 11 years

Tony was awarded ABL Manager of the Year 5 times, 2 times as ABL All Stars team Head Coach or Assistant Coach and in 2007/08 Australian Coach of the Year

Tony's sportsmanship knowledge of the game and his demeanor on and off the baseball field as a Player, Coach, Manager, and International Baseball Scout has been outstanding

Tony's willingness to assist in all levels of baseball in his coaching has shown results as a healthy reward to the State and the Nation in the success as a baseball state during his time. SABL life Member and Woodville Coach John Ryan described Tony as a "highly motivated team man and a coach's dream"

For over 20 years he has been involved in the Australian senior and junior teams & has been in the Major League Baseball system since 1993. Currently as a Coach, Manager, Scout, and Scouting Supervisor

Kevin Jennings

Kevin's passion came about through his parent's involvement with the Glenelg Baseball Club where they served as committee members and volunteers during the 50's. In those days baseball was played on Sundays at Camden and Weigall ovals with cars parked around the oval to watch the game. Kevin would carry a tray loaded with goodies and drinks to the cars and sell them.

Kevin's playing career began with YMCA in Senior Colts, moving to Woodville, a season for Adelaide Teachers College before returning to Woodville.

While on committee with Woodville all clubs were required by the SABL to have a representative on a League committee and Kevin chose the Permit Committee.

Kevin was on the Permit Committee for 10 years (1975/76 to 1984/85) the last 5 years as Chairman.

Kevin went on to joining the SABL Board for 2 years before becoming President for 8 years.

Kevin was also on the Tribunal for 11 years, 2 years as Chairman.

In 1982 Kevin gave up playing and became an Umpire, officiating in over 1500 games before retiring in 2009.

Kevin spent 9 years on committee for Woodville and 8 years as President of Southern Districts.

From the time Kevin got involved in baseball, in playing, administration & umpiring roles Kevin has served over 50 years.

Ian Reval

Criteria - Playing, Game Official (umpiring)

- 1996 Capps Medalist

Ian debuted in Division 1 for Woodville in the 1981/82 season and within a couple of years was selected in the Claxton Shield in 1984/85 being selected for 5 Claxton Shields series

In 1989/90 he was selected in the Adelaide Giants team pitching in 5 games

In the local competition he transferred from Woodville to Glenelg in 1993 for 3 seasons winning the 1996 Capps Medal. The next season he transferred to Sturt for 2 seasons before returning to Woodville

After retiring from playing Ian became an umpire, winning the Paul Begg Umpire of the Year award 4 times and was selected in the All-Star Team as an umpire 7 times

Ian is the only person to be selected in the All-Star Team as a Player & Umpire

Ian has also spent 7 years on the Baseball Umpires Association Committee including 4 years as Chairman
