From the Chairman

Firstly, I must thank our hard-working committee, many whom I've known most of my life and it's been again a pleasure working with you all again in my 4th year in 2022. A shout out to Jo Owen, Jane Nicholson and Megan Oliver who has been outstanding with our junior development as Junior Director, thanks to Lucy Owen with her role with club facilities, Alyssa Owen with marketing, Noel Watson for his ever-hard work with maintaining the grounds and with his assistants Craig Reval and Terry Fitzgerald, who it's great to see back in SA, and other helpers. Josh Mignone who has been co-ordinating our newly formed winter ball comp from 1 team in 2021 to 3 in 2022 including lots of junior parents, and to Renae Kortekaas and Shane Lodge our other floating board members.

The 2021/2022 season was again overall a fairly successful one as a club. We had more Senior & Junior memberships with over 80 in each for the club which meets the KPI of Baseball SA and more than we have had in over a decade.

For the first time in over 10 years, we had 7 Senior teams playing and were well represented in Junior Grades with T Ball, Pee Wee, Minor League, 2 x U13 and 1 x U15 both competing in Div. 1 competition.

I will start with the Women's Div 1 side, who again made finals and had an outstanding year with some great wins against both grand finalists, congratulations to 4 ladies who made the BSA Women's Div 1 team of the year and Jo Owen as scorer. Carly Moore also representing us at the recent Women's National Championships and then selected by the Adelaide Giants to play in the Women's ABL proving she is one of the elite female players in our state and country.

Division 1 Men's were a definite finals contender but unfortunately just dropped away at some critical times post-Christmas, but did have some nice wins against some top 6 sides and showed a sign of definite things to come. Our Div 1 coach Richard Olson has committed to undertaking his 4th season in 2022/23 and I thank Richard, Chris Sims, and Lawrie Moore for their efforts with the Div 1 side. Congratulations to Troy Nicholson on his selection in the BSA Div 1 Team of The Year and as the MVP and Batting Champion.

Div 2 was also competitive all season and were very unlucky not to clinch a finals berth, some fine performances and Daniel Chapman and Ryan Muggleton had them looking like finals contenders with some good wins against some of the top sides throughout the year. Congratulations on Tyson Hancock making the Top 5 vote getters in Div 2 Capps Medal.

Great to play with this group of guys who in most parts are highly experienced with thousands of games and some new faces also well received in the side this year.

Div 8 were another hard luck story jumping out of the blocks like Usain Bolt but finished off like Cliffy Young, probably the highlight winning against eventual premier Adelaide in the 2^{nd} last minor round. 














Financial Report
